Cantemus Frauenstimmen Ehingen

Cantemus Frauenstimmen Ehingen (the Ehingen Women's Choir “Cantemus Frauenstimmen”) is a non-affiliated women's choir founded in 1988. It is made up of approximately 25 highly talented female singers from the town of Ehingen on the Danube and surrounding area. Founder and director of the choir is Rolf Ströbele.

The choir has appeared in numerous German and international choir festivals, sung on German radio and television, and placed highly in a number of choir competitions. The group's repertoire consists of spiritual and secular works from different periods, including jazz and pop standards from today.

The Salon Orchestra 'Unter'n Linden'

The Salon Orchestra "Unter'n Linden" is an ensemble of the Berlin State Opera where instrumental soloist and concert masters of the Berlin State Orchestra make music together.

Under the musical direction of Uwe Hilprecht and together with Winnie Böwe the actress and singer star of radio, television and film, the orchestra presents a combination of Berlin melodies of the highest quality and highlights from the world of operetta.

Deutsches Showballett Berlin

The Deutsche Showballett Berlin was founded in 2003 and within a short time had succeeded in dancing its way into the top TV and Show companies in Europe.

The company is in integral part of major variety shows on TV in Germany, Austria and Switzerland appearing in programs such as: "Welcome to Carmen Nebel" (on German and Austrian TV), "Liebesgrüsse" (on the German TV station ZDF), "Fernsehgarten" (ZDF), "Die schönsten Weihnachtshits" (ZDF), "Die Hits Giganten" (on the German TV station SAT.1) and many more. Choreographer and head of the 20-dancer company since 2004 is Sabine Ehlen. Prior to that, Sabine Ehlen danced as a soloist at the famous Semper Opera in Dresden, the Staatsopera Berlin and as a member of the TV Ballet troupe of the German state television station MDR.

Melanie Wannmacher is the lead soloist. After eight years of studies at the German State Ballet School, she danced with the Deutsche Oper Berlin, the Staatstheater, Cottbus and the MDR TV Ballett before joining the Deutsche Showballett.

Please come dressed for the run, there are showers and changing rooms so that you can attend the scientific program after a light runners' breakfast.

Of course your running time will be taken as well as pictures of the track as a souvenir of this shared experience with your colleagues. Prizes for the winners of the run will be awarded during the closing ceremony (as an 'old' DGTI tradition) by the congress co-president.

ISBT will celebrate its 75th anniversary with a banquet in the historical Crown Prince's Palace.

The 'Palais Unter den Linden' was built in 1663 and converted to the Baroque style in 1732. It was subsequently occupied by Prince August William, the brother of Frederick the Great and then by Crown Prince Frederick William and his wife Luise from 1793. After further conversions the future Emperor Frederick III and his wife Victoria took up residence in 1856. William II, the last of the German Emperors, was born here on January 27, 1859. The building suffered severe damage in the Second World War, but was rebuilt between 1968-1969 with the aid of old engravings. It was here that the Treaty of Unification between West and East Germany was signed on August 31, 1990.

Berlin is still young at heart and will welcome you in 2010 to a great summer event in the Palais and its beautiful garden. Enjoy different entertainment on every floor with open seating, excellent dining, fascinating artists and a swinging dance party.

The Isle of Museums, a World Cultural Heritage since 1996, is an unique ensemble of buildings e.g. 'Altes Museum', 'Alte Nationalgalerie', 'Pergamonmuseum'. Experts will guide you to the highlights of the Isle: the 'Betender Knabe', the masterpieces of Claude Monet and the altar of Pergamon – there is something for everybody. At the end of 2009 the 'Neue Museum', redesigned by David Chipperfield, was reopened and there you will have the chance to visit the Nofretete (Nefertiti) – the most beautiful woman in Berlin!

The Magic of Berlin's backyards

The focus will be on the 'magic backyards', the Jewish quarter and the art and gallery scene right in the middle of Berlin. Apart from visiting well-known and unknown backyards, the gallery scene in Augustenstrasse will be part of our sightseeing tour.

A new trend in Berlin is Sight Running, a city running tour combined with culture and sight seeing. Both regular and occasional runners have the opportunity to explore the German capital city from a new perspective. Leave the stopwatch and competitive spirit at home, instead run and see the sights of Berlin at a relaxed pace while listening to your personal guide giving you interesting information along the way. The 7 km (4.4 miles) tour will go past the Federal Chancellery, Bellevue Palace, the Victory Column, the public park Tiergarten, Potsdamer Platz, parts of The Wall, Hitler's Bunker, Holocaust Memorial, the Brandenburg Gate and the Reichstag. Expect one hour Sight Running pleasure for up to 10 runners. The start and finish is on the South Side of Berlin's Central Station ('Berlin Hauptbahnhof'). Tours with different destinations start twice a day at 08.00 hours and 19.00 hours.

6 Excursion to Potsdam

More than just palaces and gardens

Potsdam: Palaces, parks – and more...much more! The palaces and parks of Potsdam belong to UNESCO's world cultural heritage. Sanssouci, the New Palace and Cecilienhof Palace are first class sights. On our tour we will wander back in time to the Prussian era and look at the most famous palaces. Sanssouci, the New Palace and Cecilienhof Palace are first class sites making the journey to Potsdam worth it. We would also like you to choose not so well known sites of the city, such as the beautiful Belvedere at the Pfingstberg, the only Russian colony in Germany and 'Little Amsterdam', a Dutch quarter from the 18th century and some other interesting places. At the Glienicke Bridge, called the 'Bridge of Spies' by the media, the history of the Cold War with its exchange of spies will become vivid again.
